#### OUR TRIP TO TOOWOOMBA


With our normal early start to the Sunday leisurly run to Toowoomba, we assembled in the driveway of the Shell roadhouse at Gailes.






The longer we stayed there, the longer the line up of P76's became as BRISBANE members kept arriving. It ended up quite a good role up and made the day worthwhile.






