P76, the car that failed, The Leyland P76, the forgotten car of the Australian motor indus Makes comeback

The Leyland P76, the forgotten car of the Australian motor industry, has made a big comeback in second-hand sales.

The P76, designed as the most advanced large family car in 1973, was nicknamed Australia's Edsel when production stopped after 18 months.

Well-preserved models are now selling for up to \$500 more than the new price of just under \$5000 in 1974.

One Parramatta Rd car dealer, Mr Allan Brodie, has set up to deal only in P76s because of the rejuvenated interest. Mr Brodie said a Sydney man had been offered a large sum for one of the cars — but had no plans to sell.

Mr Brodie said he had gone as far as Orange and Coonabarabran to buy cars for sale in Sydney.

Mr Brodie said he had rounded up enough spare parts to keep his customers' P76s running for 10 years.


He claims to have more P76 spare parts than Leyland.
