

Now spark, pull a lead off, turn the motor over, yes there is, no there isn't, yes there is. Not being convinced that there was a good consistant spark I went investigating. Firstly changing the high tension lead from coil to distributor cap. No great improvment. Into the dizzy, the end lug on the low tension lead was just hanging on by a couple of strands of wire. Eureka! Replaced that wire. Still nothing. ##\$%^&*****))((#@@!! Geoff dropped over (just passing saw your light on type visits) so we went through it all again. Done this? yes Done that? yes Did you...? yes. Just to be sure I changed the H T lead again. Still nothing!
