#### **TECH TIPS - STARTER MOTORS**

This month's Tech Tip is about P starter motors, and how to do a bench-check to ensure that they're working alright.

Despite their poor reputation, P starter motors are actually quite sturdy units, and most failures are caused by external circumstances, rather than internal weaknesses.

A very common cause of starters not operating correctly is voltage drop in the wiring to the solenoid. In most P's, this is overcome by fitting a relay into the circuit. Battery cables are another culprit, and many P starters have been sent away for overhaul, when the problem has been a badly corroded battery terminal, or main lead.

When a starter is being checked, it is a good idea to clean it before dismantling, but care must be taken not to let degreaser get inside the starter casing. A wipe-down with a rag dampened with kerosene will remove most grime.

Before dismantling, clamp the body of the starter firmly in a bench vise, so that you have access to the solenoid connections.

On the "cap" of the solenoid there are two spade terminals, and two threaded studs. One of the spade terminals is adjacent to the marking "sw" which means that the white/red switch wire goes there. This wire energises the solenoid when the ignition key is turned to the "start" position (if you're lucky!). This terminal is usually at the top of the solenoid cap when the starter is in its fitted position. The other spade terminal is for the ballast resistor by-pass wire, which feeds current directly to the coil when the starter motor is cranking over the engine. The idea here is to minimise voltage drop at the coil while the starter is turning.

Of the threaded studs, the one furthest from the body of the starter is where the heavy battery positive lead is attached. I refer to this stud as the upper stud. A good tight clean connection here is essential for proper starter operation. The other stud holds the braided lead which carries current from the solenoid to the armature brushes when the starter is engaged. The braided lead must be in good condition, and must not lie close to any metal portion of the starter motor body.

This is my procedure for a simple series of bench checks to test the operation of a starter motor:

1) Place a fully-charged 12 volt battery nearby, and use a spare heavy battery lead to connect the positive terminal of the battery to the upper stud on the end of the solenoid. WARNING: Make sure that no bare portion of the "positive" lead touches any part of the body of the starter. Firmly tighten the locking nut to hold the positive lead in place, well away from any contact with metal parts of the body of the starter.

- 2) Use a heavy-duty jumper lead to connect the negative terminal of the battery to the body of the starter. This lead must make a good, firm connection .
- 3) Fit a spade connector to a length of 4mm cable. The spade connector must be a firm slide fit onto the spade terminal on the end of the solenoid marked "SW". Bare about 10mm of the other end of the 4mm cable.
- 4) Touch the bared end of the 4mm cable onto the end of the heavy positive lead. This should have the same effect as turning an ignition key to the "start" position. The solenoid should throw the starter gear, and the armature should start spinning, very rapidly. You can visually check if the starter gear is being thrown. The speed at which the starter turns, tells you what its condition is.

This is a short list of possible outcomes of the possible results of the steps 1 to 4:

- 1) Lots of sparks when you touch the bared end of the "starter" cable onto the positive lead, but not much, or any action otherwise. This usually means that there's an internal short circuit, or it could simply mean that the solenoid is frozen due to dirt or corrosion in its internals. Further checks are required to determine the exact reason for the lack of proper action.
- 2) The solenoid throws the gear, but the armature turns only slowly- This can indicate that the solenoid is doing its job, but either the armature brushes are worn, allowing the armature to "pole" (drag against the field cores), or the commutator brushes, which carry the heavy current to the armature windings, are worn, or not making effective contact. Very occasionally, an armature may develope an internal short circuit in its windings, and if that is the case, the armature will have to be rewound, which means mega-bucks.
- 3) The solenoid throws the gear, but there's no sign of life from the armature- This usually means either that the heavy contacts in the solenoid are fritzed, or there's an open circuit somewhere between the battery lead stud, and the commutator brushes. Again, further checks are necessary to localise the problem.

It is possible to by-pass the solenoid, and check the operation of the starter, but you'll need a steady hand, otherwise you'll be doing a bit of accidental arc-welding, if the heavy positive lead contacts any metal portion of the starter motor body while the negative lead is still attached. Please make sure there's no inflammable spirits around while you're doing your bench-test of your starter motor!

- 1) Firstly, remove the negative lead from the starter housing.
- 2) Next, undo the retaining nut which holds the positive lead onto the solenoid, remove the lead, then retighten the nut.
- 3) Place the end of the positive lead away from the starter, so it can't make accidental contact.
- 4) Refit the negative lead to the starter.

- 5) Place a small square of heavy cardboard or plastic between the lower retaining nut and the body of the starter, so that you will be able to touch the positive lead onto the lower bolt without accidently touching the body of the starter!
- 6) Briefly hold the end of the positive lead against the LOWER stud, being careful not to allow the positive lead to touch against any metal portion of the starter body. The armature Expect a few sparks, because we're talking bulk amps, here Guys! The armature should rapidly start spinning. If it starts to spin only very slowly, or if there's lots of sparks and no other action at all, it probably means that the armature or its brushes are fritzed.

Generally speaking, because of the large amounts of electrical power a starter motor draws, it is best to take your starter motor to an auto electrician if you have any doubts about its serviceability. The above "tests" are simply intended as a guide to help you determine if professional servicing of the unit is required, but remember, if you're in any doubt at all, play safe, and consult a tradesman. A fully-charged battery, discharging rapidly through a faulty starter or solenoid will produce more than enough heat to torch your engine bayl

Hopefully, in the next few months, I'll be able to bribe our "Club" electrician to do some Tech Articles on various sparky subjects!


