

THIS MONTHS TECH TIP

After a few question at the last meeting I've decided to explain the easy way to fix those troublesome headlights going out when you least expect it. To fix this problem you need to take the load off the headlight switch itself. To achieve this you will have to install 2 new headlight relays. With the below instructions anyone can install 2 relays into the original wiring loom and this method even allows the original 4 fuses for the headlights to be used. You will need:-

- 1. Two new 30 amp relays. These relays must have two terminals marked 87 on them. In total there is five terminals on each relay. One 86, one 85, one 30 and two 87 terminals on each of these relays. Do NOT use a relay with an (87a) terminal on it.
- 2. You will also need six pieces of wire about 10 cm long. Four of these pieces of wire must be at least 4mm in gauge. The other two only have to be 2 or 3 mm in gauge.
- 3. You will need some terminals for each piece of wire. Eight female Lukas terminals to connect the wires to the relays. These must be able to take the 4mm gauge wir. Two other lukars for the 2 or 3 mm wires and 2 earth terminals for the other end of the 2 or 3 mm wires. Once again these must be able to take the 2 or 3 mm wires.
- 4. You will need to drill two holes in the body next to the fuse box. So you will need 2 1/8 screws and the appropriate drill ,drill bit and screwdriver.

First of all disconnect the battery. Since we are working with live wires this is the safest way to ensure that nothing catches on fire.

Now disconnect the bottom brown wire (N)(passenger side) from the fusebox and connect it to one of the new relays on either of the number 87 terminals. Then mount

the relay on the inside of the guard next to the fusebox. We'll call this relay #1. Mount the other relay right next to it on the left-hand side towards the strut. We'll call this relay #2. Now place one of the 4mm wires on to the other #87 terminal of (relay #1) and join this to either one of the #87 terminals on #2 relay. Now place another 4mm wire from other #87 (on relay #2) to the original place on the fusebox where the brown wire (N) was removed.

Now remove the blue/white wire from the passenger side of the fusebox and place it on to terminal #85 on relay #1. Place another 4mm wire from terminal #30 on relay #1 to the fusebox where the blue/white wire came from. Next remove the blue/red wire from the passenger side of the fusebox and place it on to terminal #85 on relay #2. Place another 4mm wire from

terminal #30 on relay #2 to the fusebox where the blue/red wire came from. Terminal #86 should be the only terminals left on each relay. Place the 2 or 3mm wire from each of these terminals (86) to the earth screw holding down the original fusebox.

Now check that all terminals are on tight and that no wires are bare. If everything looks OK then reconnect the battery checking that there isn't a great spark when putting the battery terminal back on. If there is this usually means that there is a short and you've done something wrong. If there is a large spark then go back and check everything over again. If there is no spark this means that you've probably fluked it and your now a certified back yard electrician. With the battery reconnected and the terminal tightened turned the headlights on and check that they are all working. Dip the headlights to high beam and check them as well. If alls OK then you have successfully installed headlight relays to high and low beams of your P76. With this modification you can now go out and buy a set of semi sealed beams to replace those old sealed (yellow light) headlights. The main advantage of semi sealed beams is that if a light goes out you only have to replace the bulb and not the whole headlight. Another advantage of semi sealed beams is that they give you White light and not yellow light like the original lights.

This system works by taking power from the main battery feed to the fusebox and directing through the two relays and then back to the fusebox. From the relays which are switched by the blue/white and blue/red wires, the power leaves through the #30 terminals to the original fuses on the fusebox for the headlights. Now all the load is removed from the headlight switch it should last and not play up for a long time yet.

SPEED CAMERAS ARE HERE

he debate is over, the negotiations complete, all of the Queensland police testing validated and now it's official. Speed Cameras are being used by police on Queensland roads. Similar in their actual detection procedure to the slant radar stems already employed by Queensland police, the Dutch-designed Gatso units have been tested on the local roads for almost a year. Unlike those used in other states, Queenslands speed cameras are planned to be highly visible, according to the officer in charge of the Site Selection and Deployment section of the Speed Management Committee, Inspector Greg Wessling.

"The vans will definitely be noticeable,"Mr Wessling said.

"They will have Police markings all over them, and there are plans to have other signage associated with them. There will be a sign 100 metres or so up the road telling people they're in a speed camera area or they've just passed a speed camera. The cameras will operate out of a specially marked Mitsubishi van parked on the side of the road."

He said the van had been fitted out to shoot oncoming vehicles (from the rear) or the rear of passing vehicles from a mounting on the dash board. A flash unit, operating day or night, will be placed beside the road (to increase the light limited by the rapid shutter speed).

The part of the system which emits the radar will also be outside the van, part of the departments "prudent avoidance" of putting operators in or near radar beams due to cancer fears.

A Queensland Transport spokesman said an amnesty, during which speeding motorists captured on film will receive a written warning and a table of the penalties, began on March 26 and will continue until midnight April 30. Inspector Wessling said the moratorium would be used by authorities to iron out any problems with the cameras or the infrastructure used to process the speeding fines.

The cameras will then be fully operational and fining motorists from the first minute of May 1, and motorists can expect to receive infringement notices about three days after speeding through a camera site.

While red light camera offenders are still required to request copies of their offence photographs from Queensland Transport, there are plans to use upgraded technology to imprint the speeding cars' images onto the infringement notices.

"We intend to send colour photographs of the allegedly speeding vehicles with the notices," Inspector Wessling said.

While potential camera sites numbered in the thousands, assessment criteria and the use of community consultation process has resulted in about 1000 sites around Queensland sharing the initial batch of 15 speed camera units. Between 400 and 500 of those sites are expected to be in south-east Queensland.
