#### **Kingston Butter Factory History**

Dairying was one of the major industries in this area around the turn of the century. The original Butter Factory was a timber structure built in 1907; it was reclad in brick and modernised in 1932. By this time, the factory was producing 40 - 50 tons of butter per week. The dairy company Peters took over in 1958 and diversified the factory into producing milk, cottage and baker's cheese, but production ceased in 1983. The building was then acquired by Logan City Council and converted to a community centre as a Bicentennial project in 1988. The refurbished building now houses the Butterbox Theatre, a community arts centre, canteen and a museum. The museum is open 10 am to 4.30 pm seven days.
