Yowee's Wonderings.

Well as you may have read in the president's report, I was working toward and outing at Clontarf for a Sunday morning. My own failing here was I did not get my act together and having only advertised it on the Facebook site, got only limited response. So a better plan is needed so stay tuned. At last I have started to overcome my difficulties with "Wild Crystal", my old white executive has returned to my world. I really do like driving the car and now that I own it again and on full rego I am out and about.

Last week I was nearly to the stage of walking away from working on the cars, due to the lack of agility and mental strain. The brakes all need to be replaced so had ideas of doing them, but found that the pads would not go into the callipers, have a new master cylinder due to the brake light coming on, the engine was overheating and when running on petrol the cars motor would overrun.

So to reduce the heat in the engine, I removed the automatic piping from the radiator and installed the external oil cooler. You may find the marking different on your harmonic balancer on the V8 but mine has 5 lines. Eg: 2 on either side of top dead centre. I had the timing going the wrong way. The six there is only 3 lines. Now with the two fuel sources where is the happy medium.

At the same time trying to get the car ready for Adelaide, my son as had issues with his work car, the GQ Patrol, and to make this worse he bought a BMW for his girlfriend for when she gets her licence. I have also been travelling a lot for part time work as well, as socialising. Really I am having a great time helping in the recovery and saving used P76 bits for the Museum owner in Dalby.
